# DRESSAGE SHOW AWARDS

Six ribbons will be awarded in each class. First place winners will receive a Good Horseman memento. Winners must pick up mementos and large awards; only ribbons will be mailed.

● **Good Horseman's Cup for High-Scoring Horse co-sponsored by Frese Frame Photography:** A special neck sash sponsored by **Frese Frame Photography** will be given to the highest-scoring horse age 4 years or older in the show. Scores will be taken from **First through Fourth Level; Prix St. Georges, Intermediate 1 and 2 and Grand Prix** performances (Adult Amateur, Jr./YR and Open Divisions). The name and breed of horse, rider and owner and will be engraved on a name plate on the handsome silver GHF Cup which will be displayed at each show. When the plate spaces are filled up on the base of the trophy, the final winner will get to keep the silver champagne cooler.

● **Show's High Score and Reserve High Score** ribbons will be given to the riders achieving the first and second highest scores in the show in the following divisions: FEI (PSG, Int. 1 and 2 and GP scores only); Adult Amateur (AA classes only) Training through 4th Level; Junior/Young Rider (Training through FEI Jr. and YR tests—Jr./YR classes only), Freestyle (First Level through Grand Prix tests) and Open (Training through Fourth Levels). There must be at least two entries in any division to qualify for high-score awards. Scores below 60% will not be eligible. If same person receives the top two or more scores, the reserve score will go to the next highest-scoring horse/rider combination. Winners will receive a beautiful white dressage pad with sponsored by **Pacific Rim Equine Products**, makers of good horse clothing.

● **The Good Horseman Adult Amateur "Good Rider" Award:** A dress sheet (cooler) will be awarded to riders receiving an 8 or better for rider in all three rider scores in the collective marks on their test at any Good Horseman show in an Adult Amateur class. The award is sponsored by Prospect Hill Farm, Alpharetta, GA. Riders will be eligible to receive only one cooler per year. The award may be mailed.

● **Atlanta Saddlery Awards:** Gift cards from **Atlanta Saddlery in Alpharetta** will be given all High-Score and Reserve High-Score winners. The gift cards will be mailed.

● **Wit's End Tack Shop:** Jan Arnold will give a special gift to the dressage show's high score and reserve high-score winners who visit her mobile unit will be on grounds during the shows.

● **Equine Consign,** Madison, GA, will give a free Saddle Fitting Evaluation or a gift certificate valued at \$50 to the winner of **The Good Horseman's Cup for High Scoring Horse**. The award is sponsored by Shirley Fargason, (Master Saddlers Association saddle fitter), 770-894-9730, owner of **Equine Consign**, a shop full of beautiful pre-owned equestrian clothing and equipment.

**\$150 Jockey Club T.I.P. Award** is sponsored by **The Jockey Club's Thoroughbred Incentive Program**. The top six Jockey Club registered horses in Saturday's show in Training through Fourth Level, PSG through Grand Prix tests (AA, Jr/YR, Open) will receive special Jockey Club ribbons. **The Jockey Club** will give \$100 to the first place winner and \$50 to the second place winner. **The Jockey Club** requires the special T.I.P. entry form on Page 11 to be submitted for at least three registered Thoroughbreds competing in order for money to be awarded. A mounted awards ceremony will be held on Sunday right after lunch; must be present to receive awards. The results will be "weighted" which means that the higher the test the more percentage points the performance receives, i.e. Training Level, no additional points; First Level, 1 point; Second Level, 2 points; Third Level 3 points; Fourth Level 4 points; FEI Level 5 points. The registration papers should accompany entry form. See Page 11 for details.

**\$150 Dutch Warmblood High-Score Award:** This award, sponsored by **Haralson Farm**, Newnan, GA, is given to the top six Dutch Warmblood horses in the Saturday show in Training Level through Fourth Level, PSG through Grand Prix (Adult Amateur, Open and Junior/Young Rider classes). See Page 12 for details and entry form. **Haralson Farm** is offering \$100 to the first place winner and \$50 to the second place winner. All KWPN (Holland) and KWPN-NA-registered horses are eligible. Special sashes and ribbons will be given at an Awards Ceremony on Sunday.

● **County Saddlery** will give two beautiful Scrim Show Sheets to the winner of **The Good Horseman's Cup for High Scoring Horse**. These sheets are of very high quality. The award is sponsored by Cindy Adcock, 404-285-0063, **County Saddlery** representative.

● **Dover Adult Amateur Medal:** Second Level Test 3 Adult Amateur on Saturday has been designated the USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal Class. The winner will receive a custom-designed pewter medal and neck ribbon. Also a list of all winners nationwide will be published in the USDF Connection. To be eligible for this award the rider must be a USDF Group, IMO or Participating Member, must be a USEF Adult Amateur in good standing, and must receive a score of 60% or higher. If the winner is not a USDF member, the next-highest-scoring USDF GMO, PM or IMO member will receive the Medal.

● **Through Connection Pony Awards for Excellence in Dressage:** In honor of the late Dr. Nancy Ferebee of Alpharetta, GA, three special neck sashes are offered at the show to the high-scoring ponies in **The Through Connection Pony Test of Choice Class** (PTC) on Saturday, ridden by a Junior/Young Rider, by an Adult Amateur and by an Open Division rider. Ponies are eligible if they measure 149cm or less when wearing shoes. Fee: See test fees on Page 4. Entries not meeting the breed/registry criteria must be measured by the show vet (see Page 5). Breed papers should be with entry form. Scores will be eligible for USDF and GDCTA awards.

● **Lion Heart Farm Trophy: (Offered at the May, June and September shows)** A special neck sash will be given to the high-scoring (60% and above) registered Dutch Warmblood mare 4 years or older in the show: Training through Fourth Level, Prix St. Georges, Intermediaire I and 2 and Grand Prix. An engraved plate with names of the horse and the owner will be added to the beautiful Lion Heart Farm silver cup trophy which will be displayed at each show, sponsored by Beth Jones of Lion Heart Farm, Roswell, GA. A copy of the registry papers should be with entry form.

● **Trakehner Award:** The American Trakehner Association gives a special ribbon to the high-scoring registered Trakehner horse in the show, competing at Training Level through Grand Prix. A copy of the horse's registration papers should be with entry form.

● **Morgan Award:** The American Morgan Horse Association gives a special plaque to the highest-scoring registered Morgan horse in the show, competing at Training Level through Grand Prix. A copy of the horse's registration papers should be with entry form. Tricia Waclena of Rosewood Farm, Alpharetta, GA, is the show's AMHA representative.

● **AWS Award:** The American Warmblood Society presents Gold, Silver, and Bronze medals for the top three dressage scores of qualifying AWS-registered horses, regardless of levels. Qualifying AWS participants must be current AWS members and be current in the AWS Horse Awards Program. A copy of the horse's registration papers should be with the entry form. The medals will be mailed from the AWS office. The show's AWS representative is Sharon Enderlein of Brookstone Farms, Brooks, GA.

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## GENERAL INFORMATION

### REQUIREMENTS CHECK LIST:

The following requirements are for horses and riders entered in a USEF/USDF-recognized dressage show:

- Rider must fill out the entry form and signature page in this GHF prize list or use the on-line entry form at [www.equestriantentries.com](http://www.equestriantentries.com). If you do not already have a user account with EquestrianEntries.com, as a first time user, you can get \$5 off your first paid on-line entry submission. Enter FIRSTENTRY in the Coupon Code section. There is no charge to join EquestrianEntries or to create and print and entry. So if you choose to print your entry, pay by personal check and mail it yourself, the service is free. If you pay on line with a credit card or Paypal account, there is a 3% fee plus a \$5 handling charge. The Perfekt Paket Refund fee has been waived for this show to give competitors and show management time to see how the on-line entry system works.
- Riders, owners, trainers and coaches must be current members of the U.S. Equestrian Federation (USEF) or pay the USEF non-member fee of **\$30** per show. USEF cards are now available on the USEF website: [www.usef.org](http://www.usef.org)
- Riders and owners must be current members of the United States Dressage Federation (USDF) or pay the **\$25** USDF non-member fee per show. USDF will issue a USDF Non-Member Card for each non-member rider and/or owner that must be presented at each show or a \$5 USDF affidavit fee will be charged for each. Joint USEF/USDF membership and non-member cards may be obtained on a single sheet from this link: <http://www.eqverification.org/>
- SIGNATURES:** The entry form's release page must be signed by the rider, the owner or owner's agent, the trainer and (if any) coach. The "trainer" signature is for the adult responsible for the horse at the show—**initialed signatures** are not accepted for rider/owner/trainer. If the rider has not reached age 18, usually the parent signs as trainer if the parent will be at the show with the rider. The parent does not have to be a USEF member since the parent participates under the rider's membership. However if the parent will not be at the show, then the instructor or other adult will have to sign for the junior. That person must be a USEF member or pay the **\$30** USEF non-member fee. USDF does not have a non-member fee for trainer or coach. The coach is the person being paid for lessons at the show and is responsible for the rider. That person also must be a USEF member or pay the USEF non-member fees. An unpaid friend helping the rider does not have to sign as coach.
- All horses must have a USDF Horse Identification number (HID) or must be fully registered with USDF. If not, the **\$25** USDF HID fee may be paid with the entry and the HID form must be filled out at the show. Exceptions: some horses do not need a USDF HID number (see the USDF HID application). Horse Identification Numbers (HID) are not sufficient for qualifying classes.
- Horses must be 36 months of age to the day to compete under saddle. Proof of age must accompany entry form of three-year-old horses.
- Riders and owners wishing their horses to be entered into USDF Regional Championship qualifying classes must be current members of USEF and Participating Members (not Group Members) of USDF or owners may be USDF Business Members, and their horses must be fully registered with both USEF and USDF before the competition. Copies of all cards are required with entry.
- Riders who are citizens of other countries must be a member of USEF OR a current member of their national federation and their foreign-member card copy must accompany their entry form. If they are not members of USEF they exempt are from the non-member fee. Foreign rider licenses are no longer required.
- Every horse must have a current negative Coggins certificate within 12 months. The name on the certificate must match the name on the entry form. The original certificate must travel with the horse (Georgia law). A copy of this certificate must be enclosed with the entry form.
- Out-of-state horses must have a current health certificate (Georgia law) and a copy of that certificate must be received by mail or fax (404-288-3500) **no later than the Wednesday before the show.**

**SCHEDULING ADVISORY:** Any one entering the show riding three horses or more per day does so at their own risk. If show management is not able to schedule the additional rides to the satisfaction of the rider/owner, the entry fees will not be refunded. Show management will try to accommodate you, however.

**"NO SHOWS":** Competitions may reserve the right to fill a competitor's subsequent ride times if that competitor fails to notify the competition of his/her intention to scratch (i.e., is a "no show"). **(DR126.3)**

**WHIPS:** USEF rules allow that one whip no longer than 47.2 inches (120 cm), including lash may be carried in all classes, including most qualifying classes, except in USEF/USDF and or FEI championships. See **DR120.5** for more complete details. Ponies in FEI Pony tests must carry a whip no longer than 100 cm. Whips are allowed in FEI/USEF/NAJYRC qualifying classes.

**COMPETITOR NAME CHANGE:** If a competitor has changed his/her name but the horse recording is still listed under the previous name, the exhibitor must notify USEF and USDF of the name change by fax, e-mail or letter. After USEF and USDF have made the name change, the exhibitor can print an on-line card with the correct name on the membership card and the on-line horse card. See USEF **GR1105-1108**.

**UPDATED RULE ON HEADGEAR:** USEF Rule (DR120.1) requires that secured protective headgear (as defined in DR120.5) must be worn by all competitors in tests 4th level and below and all juniors who have not reached their 18th birthday in USEF and FEI-Level tests. This show also requires secured protective headgear on all riders on horses age six years and younger. Adult riders performing Prix St. Georges through Grand Prix tests **only** may wear the headgear permitted in their test or must wear protective headgear AT ALL TIMES while riding on the grounds and in their tests—**exception: riders wearing anything other than secured protective headgear must go straight from their stall to the warm-up, to the competition ring and back to stall—or dismount. Casual riding is allowed only in secured protective headgear.** These rules apply to ship-in days prior to and after the show, and after show hours. Bare heads and casual hats are not allowed. This regulation will be strictly enforced and warning cards may be issued.

**DIRECTIONS:** The entrance to the Georgia International Horse Park (GIHP), 1996 Centennial Olympic Parkway, Conyers, GA 30013, is located about 4 miles north of I-20 on GA Hwy. 138 (Exit 82). Centennial Olympic Parkway is on the right. Follow signs to main entrance on right. Trailers should take the third park entrance, the most direct to stabling and trailer parking. **ACCOMMODATIONS:** Hawthorn Suites Hotel, 1659 Centennial Olympic Parkway, Conyers, GA 30013, 770-761-9155 (across from the park) is the dressage show headquarters. They offer suites complete with mini-kitchen and separate bedroom. Tell them you are with The Good Horseman Show. Other hotels: **Holiday Inn** 770-483-3220 (dogs welcome here); **Days Inn** at 770-922-3314; **Hampton Inn** 770-483-8838; **Ramada** 770-760-0777.

**STABLING** is mandatory. Nearby residents and others may reserve a daytime only stall with two bags of shavings for **\$50** for the weekend, provided they are not staying overnight. They are exempt from **\$5** night watch fee. They will occupy an outside end stall and will not be stabled with any group of overnight horses—no exceptions. If you are staying overnight, please write your stabling requests (one name per group) on a Sticky Note or separate sheet and attach to entry form with map for large groups. The stalls have interlocking stall mats. Which barns will be used will be announced on the Ride Times page of the GHF website [www.goodhorseman.org](http://www.goodhorseman.org). All stalls have electricity, running water and steel doors. The dimensions of stalls in **Barns 1 through 5** are 11'x12'; **Barn 6** stalls are 10'x10'. Your stall assignments will be posted on the GHF web site's Ride Times page the week before the show. All stalls come with two bags of shavings. Those wishing to stay over Sunday night must include an extra **\$25** stabling fee. Additional shavings will be delivered by adding **\$7** per bag to your entry form in the space provided, or they may be purchased at the park from Rob Robbins of Queen Wood Products Co., which has an office near the barns: phone, 678-416-1424. **Straw bedding is not allowed—exceptions made only upon payment of an additional \$20 clean-up fee.** Rob also sells feed and rents golf carts. Farm animals are not allowed at the show.

**NIGHT WATCH:** Dennis Boggs is our night watch person. His cell number is 770-855-7403. He can open camper sites as well as help with other stabling issues. Dennis also offers personal care such as giving feed and water for an additional fee. Please call Dennis for information about this. He is on the grounds or in the show office all night Friday and Saturday.

**CAMPER HOOKUPS:** Camper and RV hook-ups are available at **\$35** per night. There is a new camper lot next to **Barn 6**. It has everything except sewer connections. If you would like to be really close to your horse, please put a sticky note and indicate Barn 6 and Camper on your entry form. Please include your camper tag number on your entry form. A "dry camp" fee of \$15 per night will be charged campers not requiring water or power. Hot/cold showers are located in restroom building in front of main camper lot next to the park's administration office and in the restroom building near the show office. Call our night watchman Dennis Boggs at 770-855-7403 if you need your stall or camper site unlocked.

**SHARPS CONTAINERS:** There are red plastic containers positioned at the end the aisles in each barn at the horse park for the disposal of needles and/or other sharp disposable instruments, as per federation rule GR1210.4. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of such instruments.

**NON-COMPETING HORSES** will be accepted upon payment of stabling fee, night watch fee for horses staying overnight, EMT fee and office fee. Owners/riders must fill out a separate entry form for that horse and sign the signature page in all three places and send it to the entries secretary along with the horse's current Coggins certificate and health certificate for out-of-state horses. (See **Non-Competing Riders** below.)

**NON-COMPETING RIDERS:** Riders who are not entered in the show but need to get on horses which are entered must submit a filled-out and signed entry form listing the horses they are planning to ride—unless they are signed as trainer or coach on the horses they want to ride. There is no charge for this. They must also sign the entry form for a non-competing horse if they are not the entered rider, trainer or coach. They must comply with show and USEF regulations.

**SHOW OFFICE:** The show office is located behind the Carriage Room, in the building facing Barn 6, in Charles Walker Covered Arena and will be open on Friday from 2 to 6 p.m. On Saturday and Sunday it will be open from 7 a.m. until the end of the show each day.

**THIS SHOW'S** competition management and USEF licensee (**GR131**) is The Good Horseman Foundation, a non-profit USDF Group Member Organization founded in 1995. Its director (CEO) and show manager is Ann Genovese; Director-at-Large is Karen McGoldrick; and Treasurer is Robin Boggs. All riders in GHF shows are eligible for GHF year-end awards and they do not have to apply or be GHF members to receive them.

**FARRIER/VET BUILDING:** There is now a new building that has been constructed to house the activities of the show's veterinarians and farriers. It is located near Barn 5 (next to the Pavillion building). Please tell the vet or farrier about this facility so that you can meet them there.

**ANNOUNCER:** Our announcer is provided as a courtesy for the rider. If you or your horse have a strange-sounding, hard to pronounce name, please go to the announcer and let her know what is correct.

**RIDERS WITH DISABILITIES:** Disabled riders must have a current USEF Presidential Modification or a current Dispensation Certificate in order to compete with special equipment or under special circumstances to compete in USEF classes. These letters must accompany their entry forms.

**DEFINITIONS AND ELIGIBILITY:** **Adult Amateur** entries must be registered as such with USEF and must enclose a copy of their current USEF membership card. Individuals are eligible to enter as **Juniors** until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Individuals are eligible to enter as **Young Riders** from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach age 21. Competitors may compete as **Adults** from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22. Riders who are 16 and 17 years old may compete as either **Juniors** or **Young Riders** but not both in the same show. **Open** classes are open to anyone eligible to compete, including professionals. **Green Horses**, for the purpose of this show, are horses which have not reached their seventh birthday in the current competition year. Horses under 36 months of age may not compete in any dressage under-saddle class (**DR119.1**). Proof of age should accompany the entry form of all three-year-old horses.

## USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides provided the respective breed/discipline dues or breed/discipline category fee has been paid. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 non-member registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) lead line; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes. 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes. (See GR807.4 of the Federation rules.)

**\$500 DRESSAGE FOR DOLLARS:** To showcase our advancing dressage horses and riders, the show is offering \$500 in prize money: \$100 will go the horse/rider combination achieving the highest score, and \$50 for those achieving second highest score in Training Level Test 3, First Level Test 3, and Second Level Test 3. All divisions, Open, Junior/Young Rider, and Adult Amateur will be eligible to compete for the prize money. See Class List on page 8. An additional \$50 will be awarded to the prize winner who earned the highest score overall. The prize money will be given at the end after the last eligible class on Sunday.

**DOGS MUST BE LEASHED ON A LINE NO LONGER THAN SIX FEET.

**YOUNG HORSE TESTS:** We are offering the USEF test for 4-year-olds; the FEI Final Tests for 5-year-olds (equivalent to First Level) and 6-year-olds (equivalent to Third Level). (See **USEF AND FEI QUALIFIERS** above.) This show is a qualifier for the Markel/USEF Young Horse Dressage Program. The tests will be judged by two "S" and/or FEI judges on Sunday. Warm-up classes are held on Saturday. The judge may announce his/her evaluations and score over the PA system for the interest of spectators. (See GHF website Calendar page for details.)

**USEF/FEI PONY TESTS:** This show offers the 2012 FEI Pony Team Test and the FEI Pony Individual Test for riders ages 12-16 as USEF qualifying classes for the **Collecting Gaits Farm**/USEF National Pony Rider Championship. (See GHF website Calendar page for details.) Whips for these classes must not exceed 100 cm.

**PONY MEASUREMENT:** Owners of animals they wish to exhibit in a class limited to ponies or to be eligible for the **Through Connection Test of Choice Class for Ponies** (see Page 2) must have a USEF pony measurement card or they must be measured by the show veterinarian for a fee of \$100 which will cover the veterinarian's charges. If the vet charge is less, a refund will be given the owner for the balance. GR901

**USEF/FEI JUNIORS:** The NAJYRC and USEF qualifying classes for juniors are the FEI Junior Team Test; the FEI Junior Individual Test and the FEI Junior Freestyle Test. Team and Individual tests are mandatory for competitors—they must complete both tests for the score to count. The FEI Junior Freestyle test is offered but is optional for competitors. The Team Test must be ridden prior to the Individual and Freestyle Tests. Whips are permitted. Tests must be ridden in the double bridle.

**USEF YOUNG RIDERS:** The NAJYRC and USEF qualifying classes for Young Riders are the FEI Young Rider Team Test; the FEI Young Rider Individual Test and the FEI Young Rider Freestyle Test. Team and Individual tests are mandatory for competitors—they must complete both tests for the score to count. The FEI Young Rider Freestyle test is offered but is optional for competitors. The Team Test must be ridden prior to the Individual and Freestyle Tests. Whips are permitted. No one else but the competitor may school the horse on the grounds. Tests must be performed in the double bridle.

**DEVELOPING HORSE:** The USEF Developing Horse Prix St. Georges and the new 2012 USEF Developing Horse Grand Prix tests will be used for USEF Qualifying. Horses in this division (ages 7 through 9) are ridden in only one qualifying Developing Horse Test. The qualifying tests will be judged by two "S" and/or FEI judges on Sunday. Warm-up classes are held on Saturday. See Page 8 for class codes.

**BRENTINA CUP:** The show offers the USEF National Young Adult "Brentina Cup" Test as a warm-up on Saturday and as a USEF qualifying test on Sunday. For program information go to the USEF website and click on this link:

**USDF JR./YR INFORMATION:** To qualify for the 2012 Great American/USDF Regional Championships, eligible Young Riders must ride the FEI Young Rider Team Test to qualify for the FEI Young Rider division. The FEI Young Rider Freestyle is no longer used to qualify for the regional championships. Junior Riders (age 14-18) must ride the FEI Junior Team Test to qualify for the FEI Junior Division. Prior to riding in the class, riders must pay \$10 Qualifying Class fee to the competition secretary. The FEI Junior Individual and the Pony Individual and Team tests are no longer used for Great American/USDF RC qualifying.

**RC QUALIFYING AND OPEN DIVISIONS:** There are no "qualifying only" classes. Riders may qualify for the 2012 Great American/USDF Regional Championships in the class in their division designated the qualifying class. Specify "Q" for qualifying on the entry form and pay the qualifying fee. See the USDF pages for the qualifying rules and requirements. **SPECIAL NOTICE:** Horses entered in qualifying classes must be entered under the same and complete official name registered with USEF and USDF, and the name of the owner must be correct on BOTH USEF and USDF membership cards. All documentation should match the names of the rider and owner on the entry form.

**USDF RC QUALIFYING FEES:** Sometimes there are reasons why a competitor may want to withhold adding the USDF regional championships qualifying fee to his/her entry before closing date. Qualifying fees may be added at the show with no penalty. However, these fees are accepted "in good faith" that the entry is eligible since the secretary may not have time during the heat of the show to verify eligibility. If at the end of the show, management discovers that the entry is not eligible, the qualifying fees will not be refunded.

**USEF AND FEI QUALIFIERS:** This show is an official qualifying competition for the FEI North American Junior/Young Riders' Championships and *Collecting Gaits Farm*/USEF National Junior, Young Rider and Brentina Cup Championships, and for the Markel/USEF Young Horse Dressage Program and USEF National Developing Horse Dressage Championship, sponsored by the Dutta Corp. and PSI. (See GHF website Calendar page for details.) USEF allows whips to be carried in the qualifying classes. Juniors and Young Riders must perform their tests in the double bridle.

**FREESTYLE REQUIREMENTS:** In order to enter a freestyle class at any USEF level, a horse/rider combination must have achieved a score of **60%** or above in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a USEF-recognized show. Exceptions: USEF/USDF Championship classes, FEI Pony Rider, FEI Junior and Young Rider freestyle classes. A copy of the verifying test must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class. Freestyle tapes must be given to the announcer at least two hours before the scheduled ride time.

**TESTS:** This show will use the current FEI dressage—see the FEI website: [www.fei.org](http://www.fei.org). This show will use the 2011 USEF tests (see USEF website: [www.usef.org](http://www.usef.org)), the 2011 USDF Introductory Tests A, B and C and the 2011 USDF Freestyle tests.

**GREEN HORSE DIVISION:** The show offers an Open division for green horses (see **Definitions**), using the 2011 USDF Introductory Tests A, B and C (GA, GB and GC). Anyone may enter this division or cross enter into other divisions except the Introductory Rider Division.

**INTRODUCTORY RIDER DIVISION:** Classes coded UA, UB and UC make up the Introductory Rider Division. Those entered in this division may not enter classes in any other division. This division is divided by Adults and Juniors/Young Riders if entries warrant. The tests ridden will be 2011 USDF Introductory Tests A, B and C (coded UA, UB and UC). Riders performing only 2011 USDF Introductory tests are exempt from the USEF and USDF non-member fees and USDF Horse ID fee. (See **GR205-GR207**)

**OPPORTUNITY CLASSES:** This is a division for entry-level competitors to have a chance to experience a dressage competition on payment of the regular \$35 Training Level class fee but without the burden of the other usually required federation/association fees. Ribbons to sixth place will be given. These classes are permitted under the USEF requirements for a Level 3 competition, which this show is. These classes are in Training Level and carry an X in the computer code (See Class Lists on Page 8). Riders/owners in these classes do not have to be USDF or USEF members, do not have to pay the non-member fees. Horses entered in these classes do not have to be registered with either USDF or USEF and the owners do not have to pay the USDF Horse ID fee. Horses/riders may not be cross-entered into any other class or division in this show and must pay all other show fees and must comply with all USEF rules. (See GR821.8)

**RESTROOMS AND PUBLIC PHONE:** The main restrooms are located at the Walker Covered Arena with hot/cold shower facilities. There is a public telephone located there inside the main door where emergency numbers/directions are posted by the show.

**HOSPITALITY:** The concessions stand is open daily in the Walker Covered Arena from 7 a.m. till end of show.

**MOTORIZED VEHICLES:** Minors who do not have a valid driver's license, which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside, will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. **GR1301.7**

**NO LOOSE DOGS:** Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty under Chapters 6 and 7, as well as issuance of warning cards. **GR1301.6**

**RIDING TIMES:** The show will confirm receipt of entries and announce riding times and stall numbers on The Good Horseman Foundation's web site: [www.goodhorseman.org](http://www.goodhorseman.org). Check our web site's Ride Times page before the closing date to see if we have received your entries. Riding times will appear on the web site also, usually the weekend before the show, but no later than the Tuesday before the show. Please check your times and let the show manager know if you see any scheduling problems.

**ARENAS:** The show will use the Walker Covered Arena and surrounding arenas. The standard 20X60 arena will be used except in USDF and some Training Level classes where the 20x40 arena may be used if necessary. The arena size, if short, will be declared on the Ride Times page of our website when the times are posted. All arenas have sand footing. Schooling within the sides of the competition arena is allowed in the Walker Covered Arena on Friday only. One outdoor competition arena also will be open for schooling on Friday.

**WARM-UP AREAS:** The show will use the large PVC-fenced ring outside the Walker Covered Arena as the warm-up ring. It is divided by temporary fencing into three separate, fenced warm-up areas, each being approximately 80x140 feet. No one on foot or otherwise is allowed in the warm-up areas unless authorized—coaching must be done from the side. Cones or other objects are not allowed in the warm-up rings.

**ENTRIES** may be paid by credit card or check or you may enter on line. (See top of Page 3 for details). They will not be accepted unless accompanied by signed entry forms. Each entry must be accompanied by COPIES of the rider's, owner's and horse's USDF and USEF cards, and trainer's and coach's (if any) current USEF cards. Faxed entries may not be accepted without credit card information AND are not eligible for the Perfekt Paket refund.

**ADDRESS:** Make checks payable to The Good Horseman Foundation and mail to PO Box 297, Pine Lake, GA 30072.

**RETURNED CHECKS:** A \$25 fee will be levied against any competitor whose check is returned from the bank (**O.C. GA 16-9-20**).

**REFUNDS** will be given in full prior to the closing date for any reason (See **Qualifying Fee**). After the closing date, there will be no refunds. However, in the case of illness or injury to horse or rider, a credit (excluding non-refundable drug fee, the office fee, any qualifying fees and cost of shavings if they are not recovered) may be issued toward a future Good Horseman show with a veterinarian's or physician's certificate (the certifying vet or doctor may not be owner, rider or trainer) received by management no later than 10 after of the show. To get credit, rider or representative must notify the show secretary in person before show starts so the riding times may be filled. USEF requires that competitors must notify the secretary when leaving the grounds before show ends.

**CANCELLATION OF CLASSES:** There will be no refunds if classes are canceled because of weather, accident or other emergency beyond our control.

**COMPETITION NUMBERS:** Show management requires that every horse on the grounds wear his/her competition number on the left side while the horse is out of his stall. Competitors who arrive on Saturday or Sunday must come to the show office to get their paperwork and bridle number because the bridle number must be on the horse before unloading.

# GHF YEAR-END AWARDS

To be eligible for these awards, riders do not have to be GHF members nor do they have to submit their scores. Final tabulations will be done at the end of the year (after the September show) by the GHF office. Scores from the following shows will be used: GHF/Massey Ferguson Dressage the Horse Park (April), GHF/Massey Ferguson Annual Show (June), GHF/Massey Ferguson Summer Dressage Show (July) and GHF/Massey Ferguson Fall Dressage Show (September).

It is the competitors' responsibility to check their scores that are published when the year-end results are posted on the GHF website's Awards page following the September show and to report any possible errors to the GHF office.

For all awards, scores will be taken from Training through Fourth Level, Prix St. Georges, Intermediaire I and II, Grand Prix, ridden in the Open, Adult Amateur and Jr./YR divisions (only).

**Division Awards:** Plaques and certificates will be given at the end of the year to the top two horse/rider combinations achieving the highest percentiles in three divisions: Open, Adult Amateur and Junior/Young Rider. To compete for this award, riders must have at least three scores of 60% or above to be averaged (no scores will be dropped). Results below 60% will not be awarded.

**Levels Awards:** Certificates and an engraved memento will go to the top two horse/rider combinations achieving the highest percentiles in the following levels: Training through Fourth Level, Prix St. Georges, Intermediaire I and II, Grand Prix and Freestyle (any level). To compete for this award, riders must have at least three scores of 60% and above to be averaged (no scores will be dropped). Results below 60% will not be awarded.

Also awarded will be the **Good Horseman Medal** which will be given to riders achieving scores of 75% or better at Training through the FEI levels (any division), excluding Freestyle, Introductory and the FEI Young Horse tests which are scored differently and cannot be compared.

**ATTENTION, COMPETITORS:** Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct federation/association numbers (USEF and USDF) for horse, owner, rider and trainer before the days of the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

**EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.**

**THE COMPETITION** committee reserves the right to refuse or limit entries, to add or divide classes, to add or substitute judges or make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications herein for the improvement of the competition. Entries will be accepted on a first-come basis before the closing date.

**LATE FEE:** A \$20 late fee will be charged to any competitor whose entry is received and accepted after the closing date. Postmarks do not count. This fee is in lieu of the post-entry fee. Late entries may be accepted only if space is available and will not be accepted after the Friday a week before the show after which they may be accepted as post-entries at the show. Entries mailed the day before the closing date should be sent by Overnight MAIL for next-day delivery to our Post Office Box 297, Pine Lake, GA 30072-0297. **Be sure to WAIVE SIGNATURE or entry may not be received on time and the late fee may apply!** Those wishing to use UPS or FED-X must call the show manager to get the street address and special details.

**POST ENTRIES/CLASS CHANGES** may be accepted if space is available (to fill scratches, etc.) upon payment of regular show fees, regular class fees plus an additional post-entry fee of \$20 per class. Riders may add or withdraw **qualifying** to/from their entry may do so without penalty or charges, but there will be no refunds.

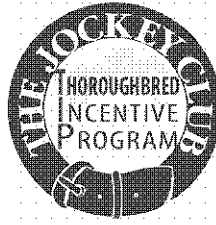



**Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions:** Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership, Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF NM fee. (Note: USDF business members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF BM.) Individuals cannot compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition with a USDF Education Membership.

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

**Exceptions:**

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, FEI ParaEquestrian classes, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

**Memberships Defined**

**Participating Membership (PM):** A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$75), 5-years (\$300), or life (\$1,500). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21<sup>st</sup> birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$60). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan<sup>®</sup>/USDF Year-End Awards, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

**Group Membership (GM):** A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

**Business Membership (BM):** A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$200) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

**Education Membership (EM):** A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. This online education only membership expires 12 months after the date joined. This membership type does NOT allow an individual to compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition.

**Non-Member (NM) Identification Number:** For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$25 and a USDF NM form per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF member there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

**Horse Identification (HID) Number:** A one-time tracking number for horses (\$25). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan<sup>®</sup>/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$70. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

**Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR):** A horse with an LHR (\$95) is eligible for Adequan<sup>®</sup>/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

## 2012 Great American Insurance Group/ USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year.

The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at [www.usdf.org](http://www.usdf.org). Please refer to the 2012 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

### Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

#### Rider:

- Must be a USDF Participating\* Member (PM) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

#### Horse:

- Must be USDF Lifetime Registered (LTR) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be USEF (Annual or Lifetime) recorded at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse/recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record.
- A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

#### Owner:

- Must be a USDF member (PM\* or Business Member (BM)) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

\* PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

### Minimum Qualifying Scores

One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for levels through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only open divisions.

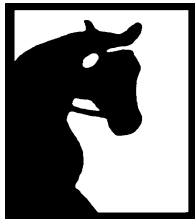
